It provides effective training using graphic materials and interactive, hands-on practice with the MamaNatalie Birthing Simulator.

## Helping Mothers Survive Bleeding after Birth

Prepare for birth Birth (See HBB Action Plan for baby) 10 IU or ≈ 200 mcg x 3 = 600 mcg Give medication to expel placenta **Perform controlled cord** traction to deliver placenta Placenta out? — — Not out Out in 30 minutes **Encourage empty bladder** Repeat 10 units oxytocin Repeat controlled cord traction **Check tone** Out -Massage if soft Not out in 60 minutes Placenta complete? Complete **Advanced** care **Uterus hard?** Massage uterus Hard Soft Massage uterus **Repeat medication** Hard **Bleeding normal?** Hard Soft Bleeding excessive Bleeding excessive Normal **Press on tears Compress uterus** Hard Bleeding normal Continue care: Check tone Monitor bleeding **Advanced** care Check vital signs Keep warm Encourage breastfeeding
